The following is a summary of the comments received on the proposed FY 2007 CMAQ program and staff notes on those comments. Eight comments were received, four on specific proposals. Four comments were received on the CMAQ program in general or on other topics. Copies of the individual comments are attached.

<u>OT01072813 - Chicago Department of the Environment - Chicago Diesel Fleet Retrofit</u> <u>Project</u>

Brian Urbaszewski of the American Lung Association of Metropolitan Chicago sent an e-mail supporting the proposal.

• This proposal is not included in the proposed program. The comment was forwarded to the City of Chicago.

As the proposed program was out for comment, CMAP staff received notice that Metra was withdrawing its application for DE13072761 – EMD 40FC 3,000 hp Locomotive Testing - Diesel Emission Reductions (\$472,800 federal funds). Since both proposals were for diesel emission reduction projects, staff is recommending that the funds that would have been used for the Metra proposal be programmed for the CDOE proposal. This will allow a portion of that proposal to proceed (the total request for the CDOE proposal was \$1,172,000 federal).

CMAQ Proposed Program

Beth Tomlins sent an e-mail supporting the program, particularly the bicycle, pedestrian and transit components.

• The proposed program includes 23 such projects.

CMAQ Proposed Program

Andrew Fisher sent an e-mail supporting the program, particularly the bicycle components. He noted that he did not see bicycle parking projects in the proposed program.

• The proposed program includes seven bicycle facility projects. Although no specific bicycle parking proposals were submitted this year, a number of commuter parking proposals included bicycle parking, including IDOT's Park and Ride Commuter Lots Along I-55 proposal (CP12072705).

Great Lakes High Speed Rail

Mike Lee sent an e-mail supporting a high speed passenger rail proposal.

CMAQ Proposed Program

Peter Nicholson questioned the benefit of bicycle projects in a conversation at the August 9, 2006 open house.

 Bicycle projects' benefits are estimated on the basis of expected trips diverted from automobiles due to the construction of the facility. This was explained to Mr. Nicholson.

Is there a way to write letters in defense of cut programs? The cut of the Chicago diesel retrofit grant is especially vexing as I have been talking with Region V USEPA about diesel retrofit funding issues lately, and they are saying that once the new 2007 federal budget goes into effect all Diesel SEPs will simply be prohibited. SEPs, Supplemental Environmental Projects, are basically funds from an entity found culpable for environmental damage. The funds are designed to fund a project to make restitution for the wrong. Usually the funds are administered by a local/state government or nonprofit. In this case, because the SEP funding the City is not federal funds, they were able to use it as match for CMAQ. This was an extremely creative financing approach, which I don't think anyone else in the country had yet used. This project also has a ridiculously high cost effectiveness score as well, if I read your chart correctly.

Come Federal budget year 2007, USEPA will get a piddling amount of money for diesel retrofit programs nationwide. Likely this will be in the neighborhood of \$20m for the entire country. (Congress hasn't finalized a number yet) But because this will be appropriated money, EPA says they can't do future diesel retrofit SEPs because this would be seen as illegally getting more than what they were appropriated by Congress for a specific purpose.

In short, the cash the City has for their CMAQ match is gone forever after this cycle. That door will be closed. And with gutting future CMAQ allocations (don't mention the war...) and having an amazingly tiny amount of federal money to do diesel retrofits in the future it looks to be nearly impossible to fund future diesel retrofit projects while we are staring at nonattainment with air quality standards.

We are tying not one but both hands behind our backs and it's a little hard to fight that way. I'm interested how this can be revived.

In Illinois, it's also reported that the air pollution created by Ohare airport alone is greater than all electric power plants in the state combined! - a TGV is a good alternative to other modes.

Also, a TGV system would conserve over 2 billion gallons of fuel a year (500,000 flights), relying on alternative energies. In addition, a big new airport consumes double the land

that the entire GL/TGV system concept would, 15,000 vs. 7,000 acres. Finally, discount airlines with multiple airplane/airport transfers per route have as long or longer travel times in the Northeast quarter of the US than most GL/NEC HSR route travel times.

The Great Lakes TGV corridor would connect 45 major US city pairs and hence, many intercity passengers while other proposed US HSR system concepts connect less than a dozen major city pairs. There are about 1-2 billion individual intercity trips annually between the Northeast and Great Lakes corridors, consequently, the 40 million trips or more a year estimated for the GL/TGV system seems very attainable. There is existing infrastructure throughout Pennsylvania to facilitate HSR travel amid the mountains there-the major concern in adaptation of this TGV concept. It is time to build true HSR.

Subject: Status of FY 2006 Follow-up

Staff sent out letters requesting follow-up information on 172 projects for 2006. The letters were sent August 17th, with a return date of September 22nd. A list of projects and a sample follow-up form are attached for your information. Projects were selected because they are one or more years old and have no obligation, because they are three or more years old and have at least ten percent of their funds still unobligated, or because the estimated completion year was 2006. One hundred and seventy-six projects were selected using these criteria. Of these, four were removed from the follow-up list because their status was already known.

To date, eleven responses have been received for the one hundred and seventytwo projects.

Staff will begin contacting sponsors after September 22nd to ensure that all sponsors respond. Based on these responses, staff will recommend to the Committee actions for projects that are showing insufficient progress. These recommendations will be prepared for a meeting in late October or early November.

- If a proposal with more than one phase is programmed, the phases may be funded over time. Using roadway projects as an example, if the year being programmed is "X:"

- Years beyond the year being programmed (i.e., years X+1, X+2, and so on) will maintain at least half their expected mark for programming in their own cycles. No funds will be programmed beyond the last year of the TIP.
- CMAP and IDOT will develop program marks for the years over the life of the TIP.
- Once a point is reached that the balance of unobligated projects is sufficiently low, a "B" list will be maintained of proposals that were found to have benefits but not programmed in the current year.

Initial Obligation

- The appropriate obligation documents (e.g., local agreement, FTA fund transfer request) for the first phase funded must be submitted to IDOT by June following notification that a project has been programmed and found eligible (typically early December). Projects not meeting this deadline are subject to having their CMAQ funding cancelled.
- Project programmed from the "B" list will have seven months to submit obligation documents. Projects not meeting this deadline are subject to having their CMAQ funding cancelled.

Subsequent Obligations


- Phases that have been programmed in future years will be maintained in future years until they are ready to be obligated. For example, a phase programmed in year X+1 will be kept in year X+1 (one year after the selected year in the TIP) until it is ready to be obligated.
- A phase will be moved into the selected year only upon documented readiness e.g., submission of a local agreement or grant application.

Monitoring the Selected Year

- Projects with phases waiting to be obligated in the selected year will be monitored quarterly for status. Sponsors will be asked to supply information. (Perhaps IDOT BLRS' monitoring system could be used for projects under their jurisdiction.)
- If a project phase is not expected to be obligated in the current year, then the phase will be moved to the next year in the TIP. Subsequent phases for the same project will be moved one year further out as well.
- Failure of a sponsor to respond to a quarterly status inquiry (or, to maintain a current status with IDOT BLRS) will result in movement of the affected phase(s) to future years.
- Repeated failure of a sponsor to respond to status inquiries will result in the project being brought to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee to consider removing the project from the CMAQ program.
- If needed to use obligating authority and/or state appropriation, proposals on the "B" list will be programmed during a fiscal year.

Two sponsors have requested project changes, including cost changes. The net change in the federal amount programmed resulting from these changes is a \$1,865,200 increase.

Northlake - City of Northlake Sidewalks - Citywide (TIP ID 04-06-0001)

The sponsor is requesting a scope change for the City of Northlake Sidewalks – Citywide pedestrian facility project, changing the project's limits. This includes the removal of the sidewalks on the N. Sandra Avenue portion of the project that runs from Grand Avenue to the south cul-de-sac and adding a sidewalk along the south side of Wiltse Drive between Wolf Road and Parkview Drive. A map has been included with the City's request letter. The scope change will result in a cost reduction of \$22,000 federal.

This project was approved in 2006 for \$336,400 federal (\$420,500 total). The change is due to redevelopment plans for the area along N. Sandra Avenue.

A reevaluation of the project was conducted for the changes and the total VOC eliminated increased from 0.4426 tons to 0.6053 tons. The new total project cost of \$393,000 along with the new VOC eliminated would give the project a cost per ton of VOC eliminated of \$649,221. As the revised ranking sheet indicates, the project's rank would increase from 8th to 7th among the 2006 pedestrian facility projects.

• Consider approving the scope change for City of Northlake Sidewalks - Citywide (TIP ID 04-06-0001), removing N. Sandra Avenue section from the project and including Wiltse Drive section at a revised cost of \$393,000 (\$314,400 federal).

Will County Department of Highways – Naperville-Plainfield Rd at 119th (TIP ID 12-04-0002)

The sponsor is requesting a cost increase for the Naperville-Plainfield Rd at 119th intersection improvement project in the amount of \$1,887,200 federal. The increased costs are a result of phase I engineering estimates of costs based on the latest geometrics, increase of right-of-way costs and higher than estimated unit prices.

The project was programmed for \$1,048,000 (federal) in FY 2004 for engineering II, right-of-way acquisition and construction. The cost increase would raise the total project cost to \$3,767,200 (\$2,935,200 federal).

The requested cost increase would raise the cost per ton of VOC eliminated to \$1,749,199 from the original amount of \$643,088. As the revised ranking sheet indicates, the rank of the project would drop from 5th to 8th among 2004 intersection improvement projects. The project would still rank better than two other intersection improvement projects that received funding and below three intersection improvement projects that did not receive funding.

At the moment, there are not sufficient unprogrammed CMAQ funds to cover this increase.

Recommendation to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee:

• Consider the cost increase of \$1,887,200 for Will County Department of Highways – Naperville-Plainfield Rd at 119th (TIP ID 12-04-0002).

Enclosed for your reference please find a location map of the City of Northlake that depicts the Sidewalk Project approved for FY 2006 federal funding. It has been anticipated that new Portland Cement Concrete (PCC) sidewalk will be constructed along both sides of N. Sandra Avenue from Grand Avenue to the south cul-de-sac (approximately 1,225 linear feet of sidewalk). However, the City has some future redevelopment plans for this area. In order to avoid damaging the sidewalk or run the risk of having to remove it, the City feels that this money would be better spent at a different location within the corporate limits.

We respectfully request to revise the project scope to remove the portion of sidewalk to be constructed along N. Sandra Avenue and utilize these funds to install PCC sidewalk along the south side of Wiltse Drive between Wolf Road and Parkview Drive (approximately 900 linear feet of sidewalk). This proposed revision has been noted on the enclosed location map.

The City understands that due to a reduction in the amount of sidewalk to be installed that \$22,000 (federal share) shall be removed from the approved grant amount of \$336,400 (federal share). The revised grant amount shall be \$314,400 (federal share) based on these changes.


