
#### VI. PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND MAP

#### 1. PLEASE DESCRIBE PROJECT.

Add second southbound and northbound through lanes on Greenwood Road. Add sidewalk on the east side of Greenwood Road from Glenview Road to Springdale Avenue to provide pedestrian access from residences north Glenview Road to the commercial land uses at all four corners of the Greenwood Rd./Glenview Rd. intersection.

(During the PM peak hour, extensive southbound queuing results in long delays and a significant diversion of southbound Greenwood to westbound Glenview trips through adjoining residential neighborhood streets. To prevent southbound through traffic queues from blocking southbound to westbound right turns, the right turn lane would have to be extended to a length of 605 feet, which is not practical. Additionally, the southbound through vehicle queues would still not clear the intersection in a single cycle. Consequently, constructing a second through lane instead of extending the right turn lane is the appropriate means of addressing the existing congestion and easing the flow of traffic through the intersection.)

# Waukegan – Washington St from IL 131/Green Bay Rd to IL 137/Sheridan Rd (TIP ID 10-05-0006)

The City of Waukegan is requesting a sponsor change for its signal interconnect project, Washington St from IL 131/Green Bay Rd to IL 137/Sheridan Rd (TIP ID 10-05-0006). The new project sponsor would be Lake County DOT. CATS staff is waiting on letters from Waukegan requesting the change and Lake County DOT indicating their willingness to become the project sponsor. Lake County DOT has applied for a signal interconnect project (Washington St from Teske Blv to Sheridan Rd, SI10062529) that incorporates the previously-approved project.

#### Recommendation to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee:

• Consider approving the change in sponsorship pending receipt of the appropriate communications.

#### CTA – Fuel Cell Bus Program (TIP ID 16-95-0039)

CTA is requesting permission to change the scope of their Fuel Cell Bus Program project (TIP ID 16-95-0039) to convert three fuel cell demonstration buses into Ultra Low Sulfur Diesel buses with EGR engines. Currently there is a \$134,271 (federal) balance remaining for the Fuel Cell Bus program. These funds combined with funds (non-CMAQ) from the CTA's Perform Bus Mid-Life Overhaul and Upgrade Activities (TIP ID 16-97-0009) will cover the conversion of the three buses.

Since the project is a demonstration, approving the scope change will allow the three demonstration buses to be returned to revenue service with advanced

diesel emissions reduction technology. These buses would be able to replace older, higher-emitting buses in CTA's fleet. The CMAQ funding required will not change.

#### Recommendation to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee:

• Consider approving the scope change for CTA - Fuel Cell Bus Program (TIP ID 16-95-0039), converting three of the demonstration buses into Ultra Low Sulfur Diesel buses with EGR engines.

#### CTA – Corporate Relocation Program (TIP ID 16-99-0018) CTA – U-Pass (TIP ID 16-99-0016)

CTA is requesting a transfer of excess funds from the Corporate Relocation Program project (TIP ID 16-99-0018) to the U-Pass project (TIP ID 16-99-0018). \$270,035 (federal) in funds would be transferred.

The transferred funds will continue the efforts of the U-Pass project. The emission benefits of this project, \$26,426 per Ton of VOC eliminated, would not change under this transfer.

#### **Recommendation to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee:**

• Consider approving the transfer of remaining funds from the CTA - Corporate Relocation Program (TIP ID 16-99-0018) in the amount of \$270,035 federal to CTA - U-Pass (TIP ID 16-99-0016) project for a total project cost of \$1,088,000 (\$870,000 federal).

# Orland Park – Orland Park Station Commuter Parking at 143 Rd Southwest Service (TIP ID 06-97-0016)

The Village of Orland Park requests a change in the phases funded for its Orland Park Station Commuter Parking at 143 Rd-Southwest Service (TIP ID 06-97-0016) project. The project was originally programmed for \$550,400 federal for right-of-way acquisition. The village would now like to use those funds for construction cost. The right-of-way required for this project was acquired using village funds.

#### **Recommendation to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee:**

• Consider approving the change in project phases-funded for Orland Park – Orland Park Station Commuter Parking at 143RD Southwest Service (TIP ID 06-97-0016) project from right-of-way acquisition to construction.

Metra – Mont Clare Station Parking-MWD-W (TIP ID 18-02-0562) Metra – The Glen of N Glenview Station Parking-MWD-N, West Side (TIP ID 18-01-0585)

Metra – Mokena Station Parking-RID- Main Line (TIP ID 18-02-0566)

Metra requests a cost increase for the Mont Clare Station Parking-MWD-W (TIP ID 18-02-0562) project in the amount of \$116,017 (federal). The funds would be transferred from the remaining balances of The Glen of N Glenview Station Parking-MWD-N, West Side (TIP ID 18-01-0585) project in the amount of \$67,239 (federal) and Mokena Station Parking-RID- Main Line (TIP ID 18-02-0566) project in the amount of \$48,778 (federal).

The cost increase is the result of construction increases caused by sewer design and the City of Chicago's Landscape Ordinance requirements. The increase would bring the total federal amount to \$376,017.

The additional costs increase the cost per ton of VOC eliminated from \$50,459 to \$65,156. This keeps the rank the same at tenth among commuter parking proposals in FY 2002. The revised ranking would be ahead of three parking projects that received funding that year.

#### Recommendation to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee:

Consider approving the cost increase for Mont Clare Station Parking-MWD-W, TIP ID 18-02-0562, in the amount of \$116,017 federal for a total project cost of \$470,021 (\$376,017 federal). The increase would be transferred from balances of the Glen of N Glenview Station Parking-MWD-N, West Side (TIP ID 18-01-0585) project in the amount of \$67,239 federal and Mokena Station Parking-RID- Main Line (TIP ID 18-02-0566) project.

#### CATS – Regional Ridesharing Incentives Program (TIP ID 13-99-0005)

CATS requests a sponsor change for the Regional Ridesharing Incentives Program (TIP ID 13-99-0005) to the Village of Tinley Park. The sponsor change will facilitate the execution of agreements with local area employers for rideshare programs. The Village of Tinley Park has indicated a willingness to take on this responsibility.

#### **Recommendation to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee:**

• Consider approving the sponsor change from CATS to the Village of Tinley Park for the Regional Ridesharing Incentives Program, TIP ID 13-99-0005.

#### Skokie – Oakton New Station on Yellow Line (TIP ID 02-05-0003)

The Village of Skokie requests a cost increase for the Oakton New Station on Yellow Line (TIP ID 02-05-0003) project in the amount of \$31,000 federal. The project was awarded \$417,000 in federal funds in FY 2005 for engineering 1.

As described in their letter, additional engineering requirements for adjacent roadway improvements and bus transit improvements have increased the project costs. The engineering 1 cost with the increase would total \$560,000 (\$448,000 federal).

The additional costs increase the cost per ton of VOC eliminated from \$1,661,390 to \$1,667,823. This keeps the rank the same at second among transit facility proposals in FY 2005. All three FY 2005 transit facility proposals received funding.

#### **Recommendation to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee:**

• Consider approving the cost increase for Oakton New Station on Yellow Line, TIP ID 02-05-0003, in the amount of \$31,000 federal for a total project engineering 1 cost of \$560,000 (\$448,000 federal).

# DuPage Forest Preserve District – Salt Creek Greenway (TIP ID 08-96-0032) Forest Preserve District of Cook County – Salt Creek Greenway Trail (TIP ID 13-05-0002)

DuPage County Forest Preserve District is requesting a transfer of funds from the Salt Creek Greenway (TIP ID 08-96-0032) project in the amount of \$694,800 to the Forest Preserve District of Cook County's Salt Creek Greenway Trail (TIP ID 13-05-0002) project.

The DuPage County Forest Preserve District, the Forest Preserve District of Cook County, the Village of Addison, the Village of Oak Brook and the Elmhurst Park District are working cooperatively to construct the project. The transfer of funds would be used on the Forest Preserve District of Cook County portion of the project. In FY 1995 and FY 2001 the DuPage County Forest Preserve District was awarded \$739,040 (federal) and \$1,000,000 (federal) respectively. In FY 2005 the Forest Preserve District of Cook County was awarded \$1,000,000.

The project costs for the Forest Preserve District of Cook County with the transfer would be \$2,118,500 (\$1,694,800 federal). The emission benefits and ranking would remain the same because the project was evaluated as the entire length of the Salt Creek Greenway Trail.

The two sponsors have submitted letters agreeing to this transfer.

#### **Recommendation to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee:**

• Consider approving the transfer of funds in the amount of \$694,800 from the DuPage Forest Preserve District - Salt Creek Greenway, TIP ID 08-96-0032, to the Forest Preserve District of Cook County - Salt Creek Greenway Trail, TIP ID 13-05-0002.

On or about March 14, 2005, the Village of Orland Park ("Village") entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement for Certain Uses of Property and the Construction of a New Station and Parking Facility ("IGA") with the Commuter Rail Division of the Regional Transportation Authority ("Metra"). Pursuant to the IGA, Metra promises to make certain funds available to the Village in the amount of \$10,507,089.00 ("Total Metra Funds") for the Village to construct a new commuter rail station and six hundred (600) fully improved parking spaces, together with certain related public improvements, including, but not limited to, a commuter platform adjacent to the station, streets, curbs, lighting, detention facilities and certain improvements to Southwest Highway (the "Project").

A portion of the promised funding from Metra includes \$687,500 which is derived from a CMAQ Grant and designated for Project land acquisition costs. Per Recital I of the IGA, however, Metra and the Village agreed to cooperate to obtain the necessary approvals from the CMAQ Program to use the CMAQ Grant for Project construction costs instead.

Accordingly, in satisfaction of its obligation under the IGA, please accept this correspondence as the Village's request to reallocate the CMAQ Grant, originally marked for land acquisition, to fund the construction of the Project provided that the reallocation does not in any way reduce the Total Metra Funds.



As of today, the construction of Mokena Station parking and North Glenview Station projects, has been 100% completed. A balance of \$84,048 in North Glenview Station project and a balance of \$60,973 in Mokena Station parking project, remain unutilized in the CMAQ grant.

The bids have been opened on Mont Clare parking project, which needs an additional \$145,021 to be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. I wish to follow up on our discussion regarding the need to increase the design costs identified in the approved 2005 application in order to correlate with the scope of work defined in the submitted 2006 application for construction monies. Following is this pertinent information.

The original 2005 application did not contain any adjacent roadway nor bus transit improvements to accommodate the proposed Downtown Skokie Swift Station. However, the 2006 application reflected additional area analysis and thus included monies for a bus drop-off facility utilizing property at the southwest corner of Searle Parkway/Skokie Blvd. and intersection improvements at the Skokie Blvd./Searle Parkway intersection (channelization and traffic signal installation). The new total design engineering cost incorporating the above work would be \$560,000 (\$448,000 Federal). Thus, I respectfully request that the CMAQ Funding for the design engineering be increased from \$521,000 (\$417,000 Federal) to \$560,000 (\$448,000 Federal).

Attached is a drawing (Exhibit C) depicting the additional scope of work added to the above project which will enhance the operational aspect of the new Downtown Oakton St. Station along the CTA Yellow Line.

This letter is to help clarify the funding breakdowns for the three separate construction contracts for the Salt Creek Greenway Trail Project. As you know, federal funds have been obtained for this project by a number of different agencies that are participating in the overall project. They are as follows.

Village of Addison (TCM Funds), Construction	\$1,815,000
Village of Oak Brook (TCM Funds), Construction	\$1,692,000

It has been the intent of all of the eight participating agencies to share the available federal money in such a way that each agency contributes approximately the same local percentage share of the project. Since the TCM funds were obtained through the DuPage Council, those funds must be spent with the Addison and Oak Brook sections of the project. It is the intent to only utilize CMAQ dollars for the Construction Engineering for the two DuPage contracts and for the Construction and Construction Engineering for the Cook County section of the project. Therefore, the following table shows the breakdown of the money to be utilized based on the current construction cost estimates and Phase 3 Engineering Agreements. Since the Phase 1 and 2 Engineering has already been allocated, those funds are not reflected in the table.

**Subject:** Status of Transit Projects

An opportunity arose early this year to access the FTA's TEAM system to get better information on the status of CMAQ transit projects. When CMAQ funds are "flexed" from FHWA to FTA for an FTA grant, the entire amount of the project is shown as obligated in the records available to CATS staff. As a result, transit projects are listed as 100% obligated, and thus not included in routine annual reviews of project status, except to verify project completion when the project's estimated completion year arrives.

The TEAM system has more detailed information on the actual obligations within grants. This information was used to identify grants that had been active for several years, were not closed out, and had unobligated funds remaining. Since a number of CMAQ projects are usually combined into one FTA grant, further information was needed from the sponsors. The list of grants and associated CMAQ projects identified by this method are attached.

CATS staff sent letters to the CMAQ project sponsors with FTA grants identified by this method asking for their help in clarifying the projects' status. The sponsors' responses are summarized below; their full response letters are attached.

#### **Pace**

Pace was asked to supply information about one grant which contained two CMAQ projects. Pace has indicated that both projects are complete.

The unexpended amount represents funds from the Commuter Vans Service Expansion - Capital Cost of Contracting (TIP ID 17-01-0002) project. In accordance with the original CMAQ proposal, the unexpended amount will be used for vanpool purchases, which will be done in 2006.

#### Metra

Metra had 52 CMAQ projects on the follow-up list. Metra responded that thirty-five of these are complete. Of the remaining seventeen projects, fifteen are expected to be completed this year, one is expected to be completed in 2006, and one project (Evanston-Evanston Main Street Depot Building Restoration and Rehabilitation, TIP ID 18-00-0532) is listed as 90% complete, but without a completion date.

#### **CDOT**

CDOT was asked for the status of eleven CMAQ awards representing nine different projects. Of these, three have been completed. Two projects were withdrawn and the funds applied to other CMAQ projects. The remaining four projects are underway, with completion expected in 2006 or 2007.

CDOT noted that the obligation balances in TEAM need correction, so that the potential funds available for use on other CMAQ projects is not known.

In addition, one of the CDOT responses indicated a desire to use funds remaining from a completed project (Roosevelt Rd Intermodal Transfer Facility - Red, Orange, and Green Lines, TIP ID 01-99-0018) for another project (Grand/State Station on Red Line, TIP ID 01-95-0060). Staff will discuss the potential for doing this with CDOT staff.

#### CTA

CTA's list of CMAQ awards totaled 21, representing twelve different projects. However, in this case the projects are either operating costs, funded over multiple years, or projects with separate phases, so that they are most realistically viewed as 21 separate projects.

Of the total, seven projects are completed. Ten projects are expected to be completed in 2006 and one is expected to be completed in 2007. Three projects were withdrawn and their funding shifted to other projects. However, in two of these cases, the withdrawn funds are part of a multi-year project; the later year is being completed.

#### Summary

Most projects included in the follow-up inquiry are completed. The remaining projects are underway, with completion anticipated in 2006 or 2007. To ensure timely completion, staff recommends that the uncompleted projects be noted for follow-up in 2006 to verify that they are making good progress.

In addition, staff recommends working with the Service Boards to deobligate unused CMAQ funds from these grants at close-out. In the past, the normal grant closing procedures have caused a modest loss of CMAQ funds to the region. The exact amount is difficult to determine, since some grants

commingled CMAQ and non-CMAQ projects, but the amount is between \$500,000 and \$1.2 million over the life of the CMAQ program.

In response to your letter dated March 30, 2005, I am following up on the information you requested regarding the status of Grant IL-90-X401 project ID 17-01-0002 Pace — Commuter Van Service Expansion — Capital Cost of Contracting and ID 17-01-0003 Pace — New Routes.

Commuter Van Service Expansion – This Grant provided \$1,125,000 for a Capital Cost of Contracting program for use in a user side subsidiary program for qualifying third party vanpools. A contract was awarded to VPSI. The contract ended in February 2005. A total of \$23,049 was expended. According to the Grant application, left over funds not required for the subsidiary program will be reprogrammed for Pace vanpool purchases. The remaining \$1,101,951 will be used to purchase vans in 2006.

Pace New Route – This Grant provided \$1,375,000 for: Service between Golf Mill Mall in Niles to Hawthorne Shopping Center in Vernon Hills. The total amount expended as of 3/31/05 was \$1,373,319.94. The remaining \$1,800.67 will be expended by 4/30/05.






## Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ) Programmed Funds by Sponsor Group FY 1992-2005
